A star of stage and screen, with a career spanning over 50 years, Stefanie Powers is best known for her role opposite Robert Wagner in *Hart to Hart*, which ran over 5 series and 8 TV movies between 1979 and 1996.

Her extensive film and TV credits include *McLintock!*, *The Magnificent Seven Ride Again, The Rockford Files, The Bionic Woman, The Six Million Dollar Man* and *The Girl From U.N.C.L.E.*

Adapted from Helene Hanff's best-selling book, *84 Charing Cross Road* has been delighting audiences since its premiere in 1981. A tender and heart-warming tale of transatlantic friendship, this bittersweet comedy is based on the extraordinary true story of the remarkable relationship that developed over 20 years between a vivacious New York writer and a London bookseller. Through their exchange of humorous and often intimate correspondence a snapshot of Britain from the post-war 1940's to the swinging 60's is revealed, alongside a touching human story that still resonates today.

Clive Francis plays Frank Doel. Francis' recent credits include *Les Blancs* (National Theatre), *Enron, The Madness of King George III* (West End), *The Queen* and *Mr Turner*, he will shortly be appearing in the major new Netflix drama, *The Crown*, written by Peter Morgan (*Frost/Nixon, The Audience*).

84 Charing Cross Road premiered at Salisbury Playhouse in 1981 before transferring to the West End and Broadway. This new production, premiering at Salisbury Playhouse in 2015, is produced by Cambridge Arts Theatre and Lee Dean. The play was also adapted into a film in 1987, starring Anthony Hopkins, Judi Dench and Anne Bancroft as Helene, who won the BAFTA Award for Best Actress.
